Classroom Expectations

1. Respect the teacher, the classroom, other students, and yourself

- a. Remember this golden rule: treat others the way you want to be treated! This classroom environment is *stress-free*. We do not judge, make fun of, or insult anyone. Failure to respect this rule will result in further consequences such as a call home with a 'Pathway to Success' form and/or an administration meeting.
- b. If a teacher or a classmate is talking, you need to be paying attention and listening attentively. Side conversations are prohibited.
- c. Almost all classroom materials and resources are purchased with Mrs. Santolla's money. Please treat all materials with respect and care. Failure to respect this rule will result in an inability to use materials AND a call home with a 'Pathway to Success' form.

2. Be on time, on task, and prepared to learn everyday

a. When the bell rings I expect you to be in class copying down the homework and starting the Do Now. Make sure to have all of the necessary materials needed for ELA.

3. Be responsible for your own learning

- a. Cheating is unacceptable. Any form of cheating (<u>copying</u> **or** <u>giving</u> <u>answers</u>) will immediately result in receiving a **zero** and a call home will be enforced.
- b. Plagiarism is a very serious concern. I will grade <u>your</u> work. If I see any form of plagiarism you will immediately receive a zero and a call home will be enforced.

4. <u>Clean up after yourself and your peers</u>

- a. I expect my classroom to be left the way it was found when entering. All of my materials will be respected and handled with care or you will not be able to use them.
- b. Flexible seating is a privilege, not a right; I have purchased each pillow, rug, seat, and bean bag, etc. After you are done using the flexible seating please put it back where you found it and treat it with respect.

5. <u>Keep all personal electronics in your locker unless instructed by a teacher</u>

a. If I see or hear a personal electronic device that is not part of the lesson you will be instructed to place the electronic device in your locker and fill out a 'Pathway to Success' form. After the first warning, all electronic devices will be brought to the main office to be picked up by a parent or guardian.

*Consequences for not complying with classroom rules

- Students will receive a <u>warning</u> (first 'Pathway to Success' form given)
- Students will receive a second warning and an email will be sent home (second 'Pathway to Success' form given)
- Student will receive a call home to a guardian (third 'Pathway to Success' form given)
- After the third 'Pathway to Success' form, students will be escorted to the office by security.
 - o For severe disruptions- students will be sent immediately to the office.

Classroom Procedures

1. Entering the classroom and getting settled

- a. The first thing to do when entering the classroom is to take out your school agenda and copy down the homework and important assignments/events exactly how they are written on the board.
- b. You will be given a Do Now/Warm-Up every day to complete in the beginning of the class. I expect you to come into my class and begin working immediately.
 - i. A step-by-step agenda and learning objective(s) will be presented on the board to allow you to view what will be taught/learned for each day.

2. Leaving the classroom

a. You are expected to use the sign language gestures posted by the door in order to leave the classroom. Once the teacher acknowledges your request you will sign out (signing your name, where you are going, and what time you are leaving) and will take the pass. If the pass is not there, do not ask to go (unless an emergency). When you return from leaving the room please sign back in.

3. <u>Turning in completed homework or classwork</u>

- a. You will be expected to write down your homework in your school agenda each day. It is your responsibility to write down, complete, and turn in your homework.
- b. When you enter the classroom if you have homework, absent work, and/or classroom that needs to be turned in, please take it out and place it on your table to be collected and/or checked.
- c. Homework that is left in your locker, at home, completed in another classroom, or that is not done is unacceptable. I do not accept late work and you will receive a zero for that assignment. Parent emails are encouraged informing Mrs. Santolla of certain situations.

4. Arranging Make-up Work

a. If absent from my class, the student is responsible to visit the absent work crate. The number of days the student missed class is how many days the student has to make up the assignment(s). If a student missed a test or quiz it is their responsibility to see the teacher to determine a day to make it up. Long term assignments that are already posted on the Homework calendar are due the day of the student's return. Parent emails are encouraged informing Mrs. Santolla of certain situations.

<u>Important Attendance Notice:</u>

Regular attendance is an important element for success in this class as many concepts build upon one another. Missed time in one area will significantly affect student achievement. Attendance is the responsibility of the student as well as the parent/guardian. An excuse is required to be shown in the event of absence and is the student's responsibility to present the excuse to the teacher. I will take attendance every day at the beginning of each class period.


